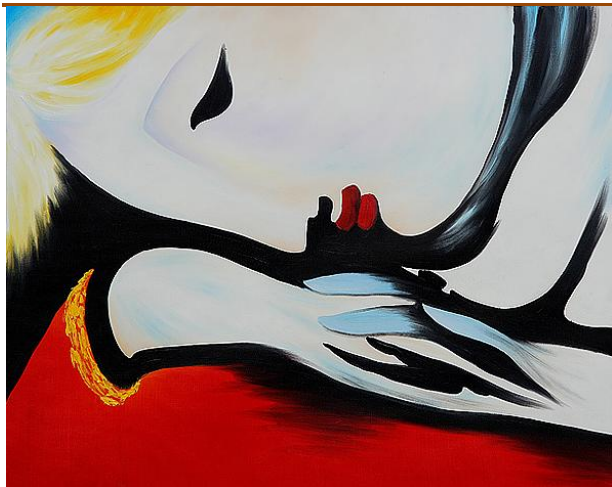


# The Center for Integrative Psychology

Join us in exploring how tending to dreams can enrich and deepen self-awareness and the evolution of consciousness. Personal and Clinical applications will be considered as we discuss various theoretical, scientific, and creative aspects of dream work. Different approaches to dreams, such as Jungian and Cognitive-Experiential, will be considered. Psychologists Leslie Ziegenhorn, Bob Boucek, and Rochelle Perper will facilitate our evening discussion.

**Leslie Ziegenhorn, Ph.D.** is a licensed Clinical Psychologist. With over 20 years of experience, her study and application of diverse approaches to psychology include the integration of Eastern and Western philosophies. Currently, Dr. Ziegenhorn devotes much of her professional time to her private practice in La Jolla and holds faculty positions at UCSD and CSPP/AIU teaching courses such as Human Development, Advanced Developmental Psychopathology, and Working with Dreams in Psychotherapy. Dr. Ziegenhorn volunteers as Faculty Advisor for UCSD's School of Medicine and on the Steering Committee for CIP.

**Bob Boucek, Psy.D.** is a registered psychologist at Jewish Family Service of San Diego, working in the HIV Integrated Services Program and the Counseling Department. He has studied his dreams in both Jungian and Psychoanalytic analyses, completed his doctoral research on the experience of clients in classical Jungian dream interpretation, and continues to work with dreams in his therapeutic work with clients. His research explored the impacts of Jungian dream work, the helpfulness of particular dream work activities, and the experiences of dreams from the personal to the transpersonal realms of the psyche.

**Rochelle Perper, Ph.D.** brings expertise in working with the Hill model of dream interpretation related to her doctoral dissertation. Rochelle is co-instructor for AIU's Integrative elective class, *Introduction to Dreaming* and has provided numerous presentations on the topic of dream interpretation to community organizations including the Center for Grief and Education at San Diego Hospice. Rochelle currently works in private practice supporting the needs of children and families through loss and transition. Dream work is a special component to Rochelle's clinical applications and holds a great deal of personal meaning.
