As our lives become less natural and more virtual, we may feel more “connected” with each other, and less connected with the natural world. As social networking and smart phones effectively pull us evermore into human-centered lives, our essential relationship with the restorative power of the natural world calls for attention and repair.

Wes Chester, MA, CAGS, Co-Director of the Expressive Arts Institute, and facilitator of Ecopsychology studies at CSPP-San Diego, will challenge the three common approaches in our relationship with the natural world, and propose a fourth experience-centered view. Might we find healing in surrender to non-human worlds?

Books of **Don Eulert, Ph.D.** range from American Haiku to the mythology of Buffalo Bill. His most recent collection, *Ritual and Healing: Ordinary and Extraordinary Transformation*, examines the importance of ritual and nature in our lives. His introduction proposes ways that we might listen in on the strategies of plants, and the wisdoms of place and seasons.

Ute Jamrozy, Ph.D., will provide a response to Wes’s radical views, and lead into audience participation. She is Associate Professor of Sustainable Marketing at the San Diego campus. Her publications, teaching, and field work include Wilderness Management, EcoPsychology, and local sustainable ecological tourism. She studies and promotes experiences that transform travelers into activists “in the service of life.”
